At St Thomas More, we believe that sport is an integral part of the curriculum, and we provide a wide range of curricular and extra-curricular activities. With the Government's PE & Sport Premium funding, we are committed to developing high-quality P.E. lessons, alongside opportunities for competitive sport and clubs.

The overall aim of the funding is to promote the development of healthy and active lifestyles, widen participation, and improve the quality of PE and sport provision in primary schools.

We measured impact against the 5 key indicators:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
2. The profile of PE and sport raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Experience of a broader range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

- **Attainment:** Positive impact on PE outcomes and physical literacy.
- **Swimming:** 100% of Y6 pupils achieved 25m swim, range of strokes, and safe self-rescue

### Sustainability

- Investment in online platforms and CPD ensures improvements continue without reliance on future funding.
- Equipment purchased supports long-term provision.
- Raised profile of PE and inclusive approaches embedded across the school.
